*SB 200 requires that HHSC monitor managed care organization (MCO) efforts to:

- Fully integrate behavioral health services into a recipient’s primary care coordination;
- Use performance audits and other oversight tools to improve monitoring of the provision and coordination of behavioral health services; and
- Establish performance measures that may be used to determine the effectiveness of the integration of behavioral health services.
